BUSINESS

Council discussed North Carolina General Statute (NCGS) 160D compliance updates to Badin Zoning Ordinance.

Council reviewed Badin Non-Residential Standards Ordinance reminder letter. Badin business owners were advised in March items left in public right-of-way require council approval and items not approved by council constitute violation of the non-residential standards ordinance. Council requested a reminder letter to be drafted with a revised compliance deadline. Almond presented council with the requested reminder letter.

Council reviewed Town of Badin-owned property trespass cessation letter and order. Some individuals and/or groups have encroached onto some of town's newly acquired properties. Legal review of letter and order have been completed. No issues were identified or noted.

POLICE REPORT:

Officer Michael Couick gave the July police report.

- There were 1,634 calls for service in July.
- With 2 radar certified officer, speed checking began in July.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Almond reported the following:

- Next limb/brush collection will be Sept. 7, 2021.
- Precision Safe Sidewalks work is expected to occur in September.
- Spruce Street Ditch repair is ongoing.
- Large hornet nest found in Spruce Street Ditch needs to be dealt with.
- Mowing contractor hired for 14-acre waterfront park maintenance.

Mayor Harwood said Conference Center and sidewalks look great after façade work, as do the new conference center sign and village green.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Almond presented financial report period ending Aug. 6, 2021. Tax revenue from property, occupancy, and sales & use tax.

Council will need to do a budget amendment for the American Rescue Plan Fund revenue. Town received the first deposit. Almond will present a budget amendment in a forthcoming meeting.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Almond reported the following:

- 1. Deloris Chambers will attend virtual CVB 8:30 a.m., Aug. 11, and COG meeting that afternoon.
- 2. Stanly St. ditch is awaiting contractor. Town is on the schedule.
- 3. Almond has submitted initial application to Benesch for 14 acre Waterfront Park grant.
- 4. Almond suggested council arrange a zoom meeting with historical society to discuss street name changes. Milano suggested council discuss before arranging a meeting.
- 5. West Badin Park Pavilion may not be completed in August. Holdup caused from county requiring a stamped drawing.
- 6. Almond spoke with NCDOT and will be having another meeting concerning Falls Rd. drain issues.
- 7. No updates on Lou Donaldson Blvd. Still awaiting state approval.
- 8. Town of Badin is scheduled to host the next Stanly County Council of Governments meeting at 6:30 p.m., Nov. 30th.
- Badin Town Council will host a planning session 4 p.m., Sept. 15th in Badin Conference Center.
- 10. Next Regular Council Meeting, 7 p.m. Tues., Sept. 14th, in Badin Conference Center.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Huntley requested an update on Cherry St. code violations. Code enforcement officer has been out on sick leave. Another officer will need to be assigned to code enforcement.

Lowder said the next RRRPO meeting will be Sept. 16th in Polkton and hopes town will apply for the new Stanly County park grant.

Chambers mention code violations: Wilson St., 225 Lincoln St., and corner of Washington St.
