- 4. Almond has been invited to speak at a CPNI meeting in Durham Tues., Nov. 16.
- 5. State has requested a resolution from County Commissioners to approve Lou Donaldson Blvd.
- 6. ARP grant is awaiting one document.
- 7. A contractor has looked at Stanly St. ditch. Almond is waiting for a response.
- 8. Next Regular Council Meeting is 7 p.m. Tues., Dec. 14, in Badin Conference Center.

Milano asked about playground equipment begin moved from ballfield to Pine St. Park. Almond has spoken with the company. They indicated it was not recommended and referred him to a local contact from Playground Preferred.

## **COUNCIL COMMENTS:**

Huntley asked about town property on Cedar St. Almond said some items have been removed, but the town need a surveyor locate the property corners to determine compliance.

Huntley asked about nuisance enforcement on Cherry St. Almond will seek a report from the officer handling enforcement.

Lowder said the next RRRPO TAC meeting will be 6 p.m., Nov. 18.

Chambers still has concerns about housing code violations at 225 Lincoln St., and reported swing set in West Badin Park as unstable.
