PUBLIC COMMENTS

Stanly County Commissioner Peter Ascuitto said the Stanly County Commissioners approved a resolution for work at Hwy 740 and Blackhawk Rd. intersection. Stanly County reinstated Parks & Recreation grant program as a 50/50 matching grant for up to \$10,000 toward parks & recreation improvements. Deadline for applications will be April 15th annually.

Tim Irvin, 88 Maple St., requested an addendum for the Celtic Festival. To include games at the event they would like to use the Waterfront Park in addition to the Village Green which was previously approved. Better Badin insurance has been renewed.

Tito Thomas, 307 Sumpter St., presented council with a flyer for a cleanup event on Feb. 25th. Cleanup will be on Hwy 740 from Barnhardt Rd. to Wood St. Volunteers will meet at the Gazebo at 9 a.m.

Doug Culp, 44512 Morrow Mtn. Rd., purchased land off of Valley Drive which is partly in the town limits. He requested closure of public road and alley rights-of-way on the land.

Gary Wagoner, Valley Drive, spoke in support of Culp's closure request.

Town Council was presented a draft ordinance for renaming of streets inside town limits. Amendments to ordinance:

- Section 4b amendment revision of owner notice requirement (add text);
 - o "... cost and convenience impact to 100% of property owners, to the greatest reasonable, legal extent possible, along with signed approval ..."
- Section 4c amendment remove fifth bullet (remove text);
 - o "Retain continuity with existing road name themes in town."

Town Council discussed a social district ordinance. Town doesn't need a social district ordinance since only one restaurant is involved. A sidewalk café ordinance grants transfer of open containers in the immediate proximity of restaurants already licensed through the NC ABC Board for on-premises alcohol sale and consumption. Council was presented with a sample sidewalk café ordinance. Almond will bring draft sidewalk café ordinance to March meeting.

Town Council discussed deer population control. Almond contacted two deer culling companies, White Buffalo and Westervelt. White Buffalo said relocation of deer is not reasonable at this time due to Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) but can attend a council meeting in March if asked, to discuss other options. Could be costly to the town. Almond received no response from Westervelt, and will try to contact them again. Any Westervelt updates will be brought to March meeting.

Town Council considered a resolution of intent to consider closure of a portion of an alley off Roosevelt St. between Sumpter and Jackson Streets. Tito Thomas and Christopher Carrothers have formally requested closure of that alley. Councilman Council recommended town consider an incentive for Thomas and Carrothers if businesses are formed. Lowder noted the town's annual Business Development Grant for up to \$1,500.

Town Council was presented with a request from the Badin Historic Museum to fund a pest control contract for the town-owned museum, building. Museum presented council with two estimates from Clint Miller Exterminating. Powder Post Beetle treatment, clean out crawl space, remove insulation, and liquid barrier termite treatment would be a total of \$2,295.76 plus \$165 per year warranty starting in year 2 for maintenance. The other estimate is for complete removal, plus treatment, and termite treatment for a total of \$7,032.67.
